The exhibit is on display at the library April 1-30. The awards show is set for April 22, 1-3 p.m., in the Eichelberger Forum at the library. A total of 15 awards will be given to winners chosen by the panel of judges.

Should he win one of the cash prizes, Devin said he plans to save some of the money and use the rest to buy additional art supplies.
