

# **Project LIFE Helps Interns Prepare for Work**

Our first three Project LIFE interns recently graduated and were honored at the May Board Meeting of the Hancock County Board of Developmental Disabilities/Blanchard Valley Center.

Gavin Beach and Roman Mauricio completed two years of the program, while Emily Bauer completed one year. All three interns took job rotations at Oler's Bar & Grill, the Findlay YMCA and the Findlay-Hancock County Public Library. Gavin and Roman added Culver's to their rotations.

Through career exploration and interest inventory, Gavin discovered an interest in radio hosting. With this information in hand, the Project LIFE team contacted radio station WKXA for an informational interview and a tour of the station. During his two years in the program, Gavin demonstrated leadership skills at job rotations and

in the classroom. His biggest area of growth was becoming more self-aware and creating strategies to help him manage emotions during times of stress. He plans to work with Opportunities with Ohioans with Disabilities to continue career exploration and secure part-time employment.

During his internship, Roman learned independent living skills. Roman had a positive attitude and a strong work ethic, often going above and beyond what was asked of him. Roman's biggest area of growth was his communication skills and being able to advocate for himself. He recently accepted part-time employment with the Findlay YMCA, and will begin his new job June 1. Roman's future goals include living on his own with a roommate and learning how to ride a motorcycle.

During her year with Project LIFE, Emily learned many job and independent living skills. Her greatest area of growth was increasing her self-confidence and willingness to try new things. With her internship experience and the rotation at
