- March 7 The City of Findlay will issue a proclamation at 6 p.m. at city hall.
- March 13-17 has been designated as Spirit Week. It's wear Red, White and Blue Monday; Pajama Tuesday, Positive Message Wednesday; Support

Special Olympics Thursday; and St. Patrick's Day Green Friday.

- March 28 Celebrity Basketball Game at Findlay High School. 7 p.m. tipoff. Performance Dogs of Ohio will entertain the crowd with athletic tricks during a halftime show.
- March 29 An accessibility webinar is scheduled for 1 p.m. at BVC. We are partnering with four other county boards of DD for the event.
- More than 25 Hancock County school classes have scheduled individuals receiving supports from BVC as guest readers.
- BVC has provided several Hancock County coffee shops with heat sleeves that feature our logo and promote inclusion.
- Pop-up popcorn stands are scheduled at local businesses and organizations.
