Medication Administration Renewal Classes will continue to be done remotely thru July.

- Class size adheres to current public health direction and availability of equipment. (Manikins, AED)
- You should not attend class and should reschedule your training if you have been recently ill or have any signs of illness within 24 hours prior to the class (fever, cough, breathing difficulties/shortness of breath or other symptoms).
- Temperatures will be taken upon entering the Administration first set of doors and a symptom assessment will be done.
- Students must always remain 6 feet apart from one another during class.
- Instructors and students must wear face coverings in the facility and during class.
- Instructors and students must perform hand hygiene using soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- At a minimum, hand hygiene should be performed at the following times:
 - Beginning and end of class.
 - Before and after meals and snacks.
 - Before and after skill practice sessions. (When wearing gloves, hand hygiene should be done before putting on gloves and after removing them.)
 - Instructors and students should cough or sneeze into a tissue or elbow.
 - Instructors and students should avoid touching their eyes, nose, and mouth.
 - Every student must wear gloves during all skill practices and assessment scenarios.
 - Things to bring: a pen, note paper, sweatshirt or sweater, drink, snacks, lunch (for initial medication class)
 - Please register for CPR/FA/AED or the Initial Medication Administration class by calling BVC at **419.422.6387**. Payment can be made the day of July's class. Please remember, class sizes will be 10 or less to abide by the current public health direction for groups.
